

## **Revised Pass/Fail Policy for College of Engineering Graduate Programs**

**Effective April 1, 2020**

This policy applies to all full-time and part-time graduate students pursuing MS or PhD degrees in the College of Engineering, as well as to undergraduate students pursuing BS/MS or PlusOne degree programs in the College of Engineering. This policy applies only to classes taken during the Spring 2020 semester.

For graduate or undergraduate students, up to one graduate course offered in the College of Engineering may be graded with the Pass/Fail option. The grade on the transcript will be reflected as an S or U, and the course may be used to fulfill graduate program degree requirements if a Satisfactory grade is achieved.

Students enrolled in a BS/MS or PlusOne College of Engineering degree program may choose one Pass/Fail course to fulfill graduate degree program requirements. Any course chosen will count as one of the two courses (in total) that an undergraduate student may take on a Pass/Fail basis. An undergraduate student may select one graduate course to fulfill undergraduate program requirements, which will count as one of the two courses (in total) that an undergraduate student may take on a Pass/Fail basis.

Students may submit a request for the Pass/Fail option for a course no later than April 14, 2020.
