Full-time students must register for at least two courses (minimum 8 SH), and part-time students must register for at least one course.

What courses should I enroll in for the Fall?

You should enroll in the following required first semester connect courses:

- **Fall Session A – BIOE 5090 (2SH) Foundational Mathematics for Engineers**
- **Fall Session B – BIOE 5091 (2SH) Foundational Applied Mathematics for Bioengineers**
- **Fall Full Semester – BIOE 5092 (4SH) Computational Tools in Bioengineering**
