

Fall 2025 Course Registration Information: PhD Bioengineering Portland Campus

Congratulations on your acceptance to Northeastern University!

To be able to register for classes, admitted students need to first confirm their enrollment and pay their enrollment deposit. Students may do so by logging into their [application portal](#).

PhD Bioengineering Curriculum

Please review the [Course Catalog](#) for more information on your academic curriculum, and the [Bioengineering Graduate Handbook](#) for full program information and suggested electives for each research area. Please note the 2025-26 version of the Graduate Handbook will be posted shortly.

If you are entering the program with an MS degree in a relevant field, please refer to the Advanced Entry tab. Core courses BIOE 6200 and BIOE 7000 are required for both PhD and PhD Advanced Entry students.

When searching for courses at the above link, please make sure to select “**Fall 2025**” for the term, “Bioengineering” for subject, and “Graduate” for course level. Full-time students must register for at least two courses, 8 Semester Hours (SH), and part-time students must register for at least one course. If you are full-time and enrolled in less than 8 SH, to maintain your full-time status you must enroll in BIOE 9986 Research, 0 SH, under your faculty research advisor.

What courses should I enroll in?

Fall Enrollment

For the Fall semester, we recommend the following combination of one core course and one 5000-level course:

BIOE 6100 Medical Physiology Section V35 *CRN 16285* (Online Asynchronous) **and**
BIOE 5880 Computational Methods in Systems Bioengineering Section 02 *CRN 20095*
(Livecast: Boston to Portland)

or

BIOE 6100 Medical Physiology Section 01 *CRN 20084* (Livecast: Boston to Portland) **and**
BIOE 5420 Cellular Engineering Section V35 *CRN 16267* (Online Asynchronous) **or**
BIOE 5420 Tissue Engineering V35 *CRN 16269* (Online Asynchronous)

Note: For V35 Online Sections you will need to file a Registration Override Form before enrolling, noting that you are a PhD student on the Portland Campus and therefore require access. Your Program Contact is Chiara Bellini. If you are an international student, you must ensure you are meeting the on-ground requirements for your visa type.

Spring Enrollment

In the Spring, you should enroll in
BIOE 7000 Principles of Bioengineering.

Additionally, you may choose to enroll in either:

BIOE 6200 Mathematical Methods for Bioengineering (Livecast: Boston to Portland)
or BIOE 5860 Engineering Approaches to Precision Medicine I (In Person)

Whichever course you do not take can be taken in the Spring of next academic year.

If you have previously taken an equivalent graduate-level mathematics course, you may submit a request to the department to review waiving the BIOE 6200 course requirement and replacing with an alternative course.

Additional Information

- Students will be able to easily add or drop courses using the online registration system for the first two weeks of the term. If you have any questions or difficulties with the above instructions, we will be able to assist you upon your arrival.
- The BioE PhD Roux Institute Orientation will take place on September 3, 2025. Further details on time and location will be sent out closer to the time.

Billing

PhD students who receive funding (SGA) have their tuition covered by their award.

If you choose to register for courses early, you will receive a bill for \$15,525 in tuition + the NU Student Health Plan (NUSHP), but there is no action required from you. Your award will cover these fees, as detailed in your offer letters (note this may not appear on your billing statement until several weeks into the semester). You will be responsible for all other fees incurred (not tuition and NUSHP) and you should pay for these as soon as possible. You will still get billing notices as these are automatically generated, but you should not respond to these.
